


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PASS IT ON Eastside Intergroup Newsletter Issue 81 April 2024





The following are just a few one-liners from our fellowship to help us stay close to our program in addition to some commentary about the quote.

1. What makes us unhappy is to want something.

If you truly surrender to the program of Alcoholics Anonymous, there's a very good chance that you will want for nothing. A new freedom and a new happiness has a lot to do with this because you realize that you already have all that you need. For some of us, we feel that we have so much that we are all too eager to give what we have away. When I am unhappy, my inner calculator is in

adding mode. Addition might provide some happiness, but that will only last about as long as a cocktail. Subtraction, more often than not, is the key to getting back on the beam. Letting go of anger, purging your home of things you no longer need, and giving your fears to your Higher Power is happiness by subtraction. When we add, we are headed for unhappiness.

2. If a Higher Power isn't in your life, the ego is driving.

Remember that we deal with EGO: cunning, baffling, powerful. Without help, it is too much for us. Yes, our preamble tells us this is the case as it pertains to alcohol, but I have come to learn that my ego is the driving force, but one of its ideas is "let's have a drink." It takes a long time for me to recognize that my ego has taken the wheel, but I can avoid this altogether if I make my Spiritual Practice priority number one. I haven't had a drink in over five years, but I can still veer of course and behave just as bad (if not worse) as I did when I was in my cups. The only difference is that my breath doesn't smell as bad. How do I get or rid of ego? Ego never goes away. There is a use for it, but that's another conversation. My ego needs to be put in its place so my Higher Power can show me what peace and reliability looks like. Pausing is the key, which takes a lot in some cases, but working this program will setup your property with highly sensitive security sensors so you will know when a course correction is needed before it's too late. Keep in mind that non of this is pass or fail. The more we learn about ourselves, the better we will be at loving and accepting who we really are.

3. Turn it over and the results are instantaneous.

By nature, I am a very private person. That's a nice way of saying that I can do it myself and I don't like to share. A friend of mine made a suggestion to me a few weeks ago that made a powerful impact. His suggestion was in the form of a question. "Why don't you bring God into it?" My friend could tell that I was trying to take on and manage too much and it should come as no surprise to you that this approach was not working as I would have it. When I started in the program, I kept hearing people share about turning it over, which made me think about cooking for some reason. Sometimes how things are worded throw me off. My friend put it another way when he suggested including God in my ideas and challenges. If I have no problem asking my friends for help, then why do I hesitate to seek God first when I am overwhelmed from trying to do everything myself?

I hope this helps, and I'll see you at a meeting.

The Property Manager provided us with our rent increase for 2024. Rent goes up by \$7.25/mo. That's a relief!






