

### From the Spiral #50

The following are just a few one-liners from our fellowship to help us stay close to our program in addition to some commentary about the quote.

#### 1. If I'm not the problem, there is no solution

A regular and almost predictable occurrence in our lives in recovery is that we are tempted by the thought factory that is our ego. I tend to liken our ego to the Devil. The Devil never acts, but it proposes, asks questions, and is reactionary. When we decide with the ego in mind, we are running with the Devil, as Van Halen teaches us. Yes, I just quoted Van Halen. If we fail to take ownership of our actions, then we are absolved. We are the victim, which we lean on to attract attention, albeit the wrong kind of attention. Attraction over promotion is one of our guiding principles in recovery, but the appropriate kind of attraction is the goal. Appropriate attraction is a side effect of a pattern of behavior. My Sponsor taught me that you can either take the lead and do things right, or cause harm and then need to do the right thing. If you get this in the wrong order, you might be due for a 4th, 8th, and 9th Step. Ask your Sponsor for more on that. When you concede that you are the problem, you now are in the position of the predator, not the victim. If we are remotely in touch with our Higher Power, you will be guided toward the next right action, which is usually something along the lines of making amends. If you are new and reading this, do not confuse making amends with saying you're sorry. Making amends is to repair damage you have caused, try not to cause additional harm in the future, and to ask for forgiveness.

#### 2. Reality is my Higher Power

My dad used to refer to Nordstrom as the Cocaine Store because if you go inside, you will see one thing you like, buy it, and then go nuts and walk out with a bunch of stuff you don't need purchased with money you do not have. I must confess that while I did not have a Cocaine Problem, I still struggle with my Nordstrom Problem, and there really isn't much difference between the two. I have mentioned before that my first thought is wrong, consistently. My second thought is usually sourced from my Higher Power, or my heart as I tell the newcomer who initially wants no part of the God component. The essence of my second thought and its source is the reality of whatever decision I am dealing with. How does my Higher Power want me to show up in this situation, regardless of other's behavior?

#### 3. When I fight reality, I suffer. (Suffering is optional)

Fighting reality is your recovery trying to break through. If you're NOT fighting reality, you're likely in acceptance. A manageable amount of suffering in life is inevitable, but our concern is with unnecessary suffering. We fight reality, suffer as a result, and it becomes too much for us, so we escape into comfort or even numbness. Whether we use alcohol to achieve this numbness is irrelevant because the drinking is not our problem. The escape is our problem because we resist reality, sober or not. Page 417 in the Big Book is our antidote to unnecessary suffering. This page reminds us that we do not have to suffer. Suffering, as we have experienced it, is optional. This is also why we ask for our Higher Power to relieve us from the bondage of self.

I hope this helps, and I'll see you at a meeting.


