

The following are just a few one-liners from our fellowship to help us stay close to our program in addition to some commentary about the quote.

1. Call the people on your phone list when you feel good, so it's easier to call when you feel bad.

Good times and bad times are the same in that they are both temporary, but for this alcoholic I cannot hesitate to call when I need help. Hesitation feeds isolation. When things are good, however, one might say that it is even more important to call your fellow AAs. When my Sponsor calls me to share good news in his life, it makes me feel good. My attention re-routes to his state of joy instead of my fixation on me. Additionally, I get reminded of the gifts of our program provided we do the work, stay connected, and keep the program priority number one.

2. If you have five days of sobriety, help the person who has four.

Success in this program boils down to one thing: stay out of self, or to put it in one word, service.

When I heard this line at my Home Group last week, it reminded me of how fragile the newcomer is because their own program has failed them and have yet to accept a new program. Regardless of how new to sobriety you are, it is never too early to begin the Spiritual Practice of turning your attention to someone you can help. If you have 20 days or 20 years, you can be useful to someone besides yourself. When I get in my head, it is usually because I want something. Being in my head doesn't get me what I want. Helping others provides the unexpected gift of fulfillment. The power of fulfillment is humbling in that it allows me to step outside myself, take stock of my blessings, and recognize all the gifts I have been given.

3. How and what we feel is where we connect.

My first meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous was a complete blur. I was 21 years old and my attendance was simply a means of checking off an item on a list. Seventeen years later, I had a completely different experience. People were sharing the same feelings I had. Until that moment, I swore that I was the only person feeling so much shame, pain, and despair. This calmed me down and filled my heart with hope that I could deal with my feelings without booze and drugs. This experience also provided a sense of wonder that guided me toward working the steps that eventually gave me a life for which I am proud. When you hear someone say to look for the similarities, it means to listen to others share their thoughts and feelings because chances are you've had them too. Connection is the opposite of addiction.

I hope this helps, and I'll see you at a meeting.
