

From the Spiral

The following are just a few one-liners from our fellowship to help us stay close to our program in addition to some commentary about the quote.

1. The disease of perception is best managed by sharing---better out than in.

Our thoughts tend to pile up in our mind, and our life before recovery taught us to keep it all locked in the vault. If we let this go on for too long, we struggle to know what is real and what is our disease of perception. The solution lies in sharing those thoughts with someone else. I cannot expect to be called on in a meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous, but I need to let my thoughts out with another alcoholic before I cause harm. Better out than in has always made the difference. I have been on my way to a meeting and felt so heavy and out of control only to leave a meeting feeling lighter and at peace. It's as if I need to try out my thoughts on another alcoholic to be free of them. If you're new to this, I promise that you will not be laughed at, ignored, or judged when you try this with one of us. Your leap of faith will be met with familiarity and connection.

2. If you complete your 4th and 5th Steps, you have a good shot at staying sober.

I am grateful to learn that my Sponsee has completed his first 4th Step. He called me this week for help on one item and the fourth column. Afterwards, I told him that he is on the precipice of crossing over to a new way of living. I have been in the rooms long enough to see the difference between those of us who have completed a 4th and 5th Step and those who have not. You can feel it in their shares. While I was working on my first 4th Step, I was constantly being reminded to leave nothing out if I wanted to stay sober and truly feel the impact of the Spiritual Experience. Again, there is something so powerful about letting out your darkest secrets and past pain that hits the reset button. This is why I cannot recommend Sponsorship enough. Finding someone you can be honest with and who has been fearless and thorough will show you the way with compassion. If you need a Sponsor, or have had a hard time finding a good fit, go to the Eastside Intergroup in Bellevue and talk to one of us. We are there to help.

3. First thought: wrong. Sometimes, second thought: also wrong.

When was the last time you actually did as the Big Book suggested and paused? For me, my thoughts tend to get off the beam when one or more aspects of my program are beginning to suffer. They also creep in when I am Hungry, Angry, Lonely, and Tired. Life feels like a fast moving ride where I either hop on or miss it. When I'm actively out in the world, it seems as though the activity of it all is faster than my thoughts so when I act, I blow it. Maybe, I tell a joke that misfires, or I forget to tell someone something, or I fail to assert myself. In these moments of missed opportunities are where I find myself having a thought. Thanks to my training in Alcoholics Anonymous, 90 percent of the time, I can pause and say to myself, "First thought: wrong." Every now and then, thought number two will also be a no-go, which means it's time for a meeting, a phone call to my Sponsor, or both.

I hope this helps, and I'll see you at a meeting.
