Throughout my time at Eastside Intergroup I've enjoyed countless calls and visits from fellow alcoholics and have had the opportunity to carry the message to a few people that have walked into the office asking about A.A. -one being our mail carrier several years ago.

You all have touched my life and I hope I have touched yours if not only in a small way.

I am looking forward to this next chapter in my life and seeing you all in meetings.

From the Spiral #45

The following are just a few one-liners from our fellowship to help us stay close to our program in addition to some commentary about the quote.

1. When I finally stopped drinking, my life didn't get better, but it stopped getting worse.

This line speaks to a concept that makes some of us who have been around awhile laugh out loud, but when you're new, it can be a frustrating realization. I know what it's like to look in the mirror at day fifteen and say to myself, "Well, is this it? I quit drinking for this?!" Patience has always been something I've been impatient with because I tend to not focus on the journey. Getting to drunk seemed to take longer and longer. The enjoyment and relief of that first drink was only an expression of what was soon to happen. It took months to notice that things were starting to go in a better direction, but it was gradual just like how our Sponsor takes us through the steps. Every day I don't take a drink, I get a little further away from where I began all alone in that airport bar. My Grand-Sponsor reminds me how one day feels like forever, then a few days become a week. After awhile those weeks turn into months, and before you know it, you have a year and so on. Time will do its thing. My responsibility is to work my program. If my life stops getting worse one day at a time, I know I'm doing it right.

2. The worst things I did in my life are an asset to someone else.

My story will save someone else's life is another way to look at this line. The first time I heard this, I thought it was preposterous. After 90 meetings in 90 days, it dawned on me that the stories of others comforted me in a way that I always wanted booze to do but never did. The scariest symptom of this disease is that it constantly tries to convince me that I am unique. To this day, when I hear someone else tell my story, I have a spiritual experience that leaves me stunned. If other people feel like I do and struggle with life on life's terms, then I have found a fellow soldier who can join forces with me. Like the song says, "United we stand, divided we fall." The rooms inspired me to share my awful stories so that they may make someone else feel relief. The unexpected bonus is that when I stop harboring my shameful stories, I experience hope and peace.

3. If you're new, lean in; if you've got 10 years sober, lean in.

When I made it to one year sober, someone told me to lean in. People who have decades sober have suggested to me two words: more program. The Big Book mentions resting on your laurels, which roughly translates to taking your foot off the gas because you think you've won. To continue the metaphor, this race is a marathon and not a sprint. Regardless of how far ahead you are, your disease is always gaining on you. As hard as it may be, lean in any way and every way you can. Watching the energy and enthusiasm of people in the program who have 60, 90, and 180 days sober invigorates me and acts as a spiritual tap on the shoulder. They really want it and have found a life they don't want to lose. Even the guy who is 84 years old and has nearly 50 years sober refuses to back off. To see what it means to lean in, go to a meeting and just watch.

I hope this helps, and I'll see you at a meeting.


